Student of the Week

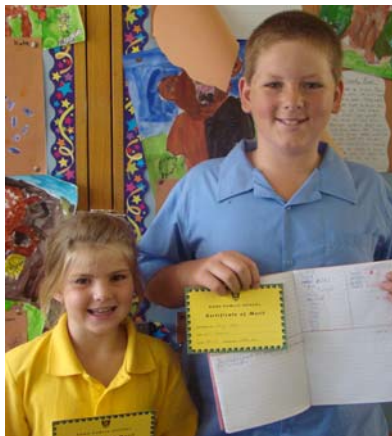
Kate was selected Student of the Week for “using her initiative to help others and always setting and achieving high expectations”.
