# Here's a great activity for a hot Summer's day... Making ice cream!

#### You will need:

Two plastic bags, one big and one small – good quality zip lock ones 6 tblsp of salt lce (about 2 trays worth or four big handfuls) ½ cup cream Dash of vanilla

I tblsp caster sugar

#### Method:

Place cream, sugar and vanilla in small plastic bag, seal well.

Place salt, ice and small bag with cream mixture in the larger bag, seal well.

Scrunch the bags together gently – after about 10 mins you will have lovely cool ice cream to eat!

You can add flavours or fruit to your mix if you wish.

How does it work? The ice turns to water by the addition of salt and this keeps the temperature low enough (about  $-3^{\circ}$ ) for the cream to turn into ice-cream.
