Primary Class Learning News

Years 3-6 – Mrs sayasenh

Whose point of view is it?

Term 4 has started off with lots of learning in our classroom. We have continued with our learning about points of view and perspectives in English. We are focusing on identifying multiple perspectives in written and multimodal texts (Two or more communication modes for example, print, image and spoken text, as in film or computer presentations.) We have viewed some short digital films in class. Lots of discussions and analysing was made about what we saw and whose point of view was being told. We completed different charts to summarise the different points of view. We have learnt that, when you read a story, the author is trying to help you imagine what the character is thinking to help you understand why the character did something. Have you ever felt like you wouldn't have done an event the same way a character did it in a book or film?

We are now composing short pieces of texts to show points of view and exploring how changing a point of view could change a story in different types of texts.

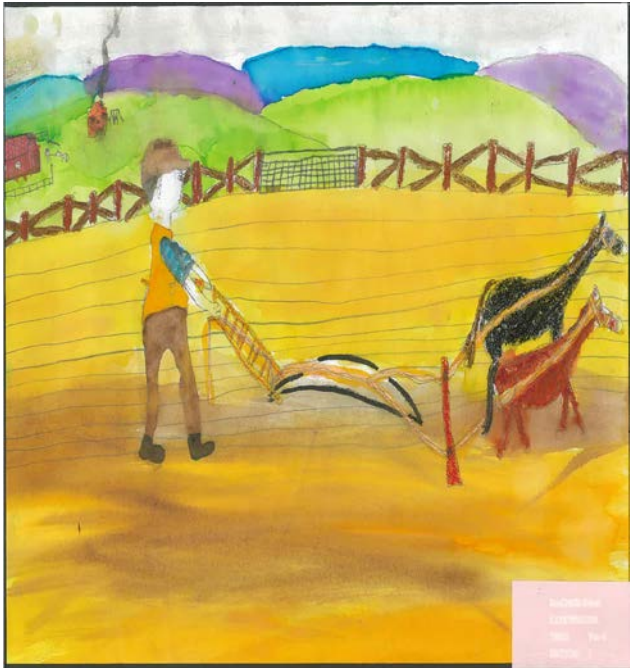
