Professional Learning

Mrs Morey and Mrs Sayasenh attended a workshop last Friday on the implementation of the new finance system by the NSW Department of Education. There will be many mandatory tasks to be completed and training sessions to attend for the rest of this year and during Terms 1 and 2, 2017. So what is Leading Management and Business Reform (LMBR)?

The new system is a comprehensive and integrated IT (information technology) system to better support the many aspects of teaching and learning in NSW Public School. It will enable schools to manage finance, budgeting and student information more effectively. It is not just about technology, but about changing the way we work as a school and as a school community as a whole.

Class Learning News - Primary

We were all excited about the arrival of our school's five new HP Probooks and are eagerly awaiting the for the remaining three! We will be using them to enhance our learning and build our capacity to become creative, confident and critical thinkers. It will enable us to access information instantly and be more flexible and mobile when presenting and recording our learning across the different key learning areas. An example of this is using Printing Press tool in Geography to create a brochure on specific landmarks in Canberra that Stage 3 students will be visiting on their school excursion. Stage 2 students will also be creating a brochure on some landforms that can be found in Australia. Our class, including Mrs Sayasenh will be learning about coding and hope to build our skills in coding. We will be using a web base program called SCRATCH.

Scratch is a free visual programming language developed to help simplify the process of creating and programming such things as animations, games, music and interactive stories. It is designed to teach computational thinking using a simple but powerful building-block approach to software development that focuses more on problem solving.

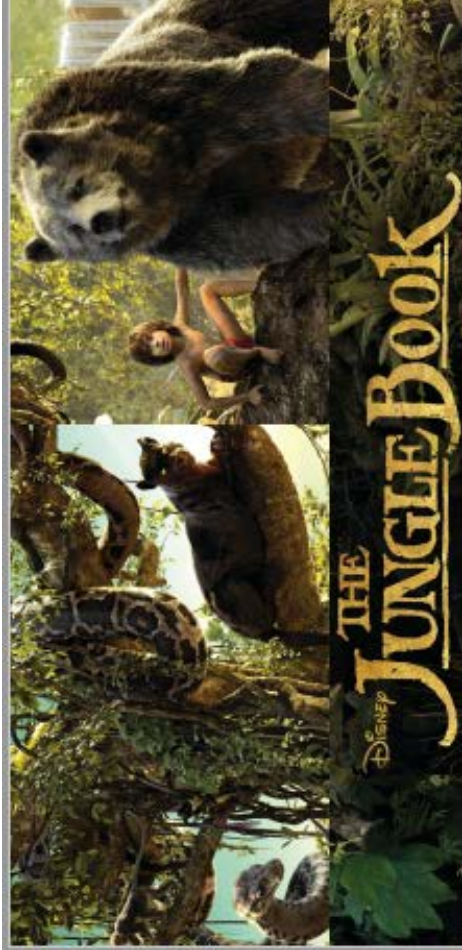
