## Vale Graham Hyde

This year we will dedicate our annual Presentation Night to the memory of Mr Graham Hyde, beloved Principal from 1990-2005. In consultation with the P&C, we have also established a perpetual shield to honour Graham: The Graham Hyde Senior Values Award. The citation reads:

*Mr* Graham Hyde was Principal at Rand Public School for 16 years from 1990 to 2005. *Mr* Hyde was passionate about the power of sporting and recreational opportunities to transform young people's lives. He was instrumental in establishing the Rand Football-Netball Carnival as a feature in the region's junior sporting calendar and the major annual fundraiser for our school.

*Mr* Hyde was a committed teacher and school leader who believed in developing students as well-rounded individuals, with the skills to strive for their personal best, care for others and contribute to their community. We award the Graham Hyde Senior Values Award to a student from Years 3-6 who consistently upholds our school values of kindness, respect and best effort.

Special thanks to Amanda McCall and Courtney Trethowan who spent hours trawling through the school photo archives to unearth some very special memories of Graham and put together a legacy book of photographs for his wife, Catherine, and their family at Graham's memorial tomorrow.

#### Presentation Night – Monday 5pm

We will commence our annual Presentation Night at the Hall at 5pm. Thank you for understanding that, this year, Presentation Night is a parents-only event. Pre-school aged children are welcome to attend, but unfortunately older siblings are not able to attend due to COVID restrictions. Families will have allocated seating to allow for physical distancing. Your children will sit with you during the ceremony.

Please ensure that you arrive in plenty of time to check-in using the school QR code and to show staff your Medicare digital vaccination certificate. Without this proof of vaccination, unfortunately we will not be able to allow you to enter the venue.

#### Year 6 Graduation Luncheon – Tuesday 1pm

We will be switching the lunch and recess breaks on Tuesday. <u>Your child will not need to bring lunch</u> – this is catered by our wonderful P&C. I would especially like to thank Linda Collier and Melinda Andrews for the phenomenal effort that goes into catering for our whole school, plus Year 6 parents!

Year 6 parents will have received their invitation. Once again, check-in and proof of vaccination will be required for all adults in attendance.

#### Walla Pool – Wednesday 10am-2pm

Thank you to the parents who have offered to drive their children to the pool – this has enabled us to travel in one bus and halve our transport costs! We are looking forward to enjoying a fun day with you. Children will be swim-tested on arrival and receive a coloured band indicating which pool they are permitted to swim in.

Lunch will be catered with a sausage sizzle, prima and icy pole for all students.

Please ensure your child brings: sunscreen, a broad-brimmed hat, water bottle, recess snack and fruit, towel, change of underwear and a plastic bag for wet swimmers. They should come to school wearing their swimmers under their school uniform.

The much-anticipated redevelopment of our 3-6 classroom and library will finally take place over the summer holidays. The ceiling will be replaced, new carpets installed, walls painted and a moveable partition wall installed. Thanks to the generosity of our amazing P&C, new library shelving will be installed.
