Dear families,

We did it! I'm very pleased to confirm that, following the Premier's announcement of the lifting of stay-at-home orders for our region, we will be welcoming all students back to school from next Monday 13 September.

Miss Dean, Miss M and I have been in awe of the outstanding effort our students (and parents!) have been putting into learning from home. The teachers eagerly awaited the return of learning packs each Friday to check in on their students' progress and loved staying in touch with them via the



morning Zoom session and Google classrooms. Your support in keeping students at home wherever possible has been very much appreciated. Now it is time for us to make plans for a COVID-safe return to school.

COVID-safe Schools

We will return to school under COVID-safe Level 3 school operations which are summarised below. Comprehensive information for families is available from the Department of Education website. (Information in italics below has come directly from Department of Education 'Advice to Families' for Level 3 operations.)

Lunch Orders

I'll start with the good news: Friday lunch orders will resume from next week. (Thanks Jude!)

Masks and Hygiene

Masks will continue to be required for all staff and visitors to schools. You may have seen some information in the media regarding mask recommendations for primary-school aged students. Masks will not be mandatory for our students on return to school, however they are available at school should a child/their parents wish them to wear one.

Students will be supported to practice good hygiene habits at school including frequent hand-washing, use of sanitiser and cough/sneeze hygiene. Enhanced cleaning, including mid-day cleaning of high-touch surfaces, will continue.

Visitors

Non-essential visitors, including parents, will not be permitted on school grounds. Any visitors entering the site must wear a mask and sign in using the QR code.

School Pick-ups and Drop-offs

Parents are requested to remain in their cars when dropping students to school and on pickup wherever it is safely possible to do so. Please wear masks and practice physical distancing near school grounds.

Symptoms and Attendance

Students must not attend work or school if unwell, even with mild symptoms of COVID-19. Any person with any COVID-19 symptoms must be sent home and not return to school unless:

- they have isolated for 10 days, when no medical certificate is available
- they have a negative COVID-19 test result and are symptom free.

In circumstances where children have other medical reasons for recurrent symptoms, a letter from their GP is sufficient to negate the requirement for a negative test.

Staff Vaccinations

From 8 November all school staff are required to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19.

Events and Community Use

- Community use of school facilities, including P&C meetings, is not currently permitted. (Preschool will continue onsite.)
- We are unable to hold assemblies, presentation nights, etc.
- Excursions, camps and other off-site activities are not permitted.
- If we are still operating under Level 3 restrictions late in Term 4, I will liaise with Year 6 parents to plan a graduation ceremony and celebration within the guidelines.

Please remember that if you have any questions at all we are only a phone call/ email away.

Kindergarten Enrolments and Transition to School

Unfortunately, transition to school arrangements have been postponed until we receive further Departmental advice, however preparations are definitely underway to welcome our new Kindergarten students in 2022.

Fractions




